International News

Transport for London Announces Takeover of Surrey Rail Networks **By: James Scannell**

In January Transport for London (TfL) announced plans to take over more rail services from Surrey to London. TfL which operates all rail services in the Greater London area, has won government backing to take over the Southern Rail franchise in 2018, operating services from Dorking, Redhill and Reigate to the capital. This will then be followed by TfL taking over Southern, Thameslink and Great Northern services in 2021. The British Government and TfL are currently consulting ahead of the publication of detailed proposals.

TfL is also expected to control the South West Trains (SWT) franchise from 2017, which connects places such as Halsemere, Godalming, Walton, Esher and Guildford to London, but SWT say discussions are still on-going. The South West Trains franchise is currently under negotiation but is likely to include a "break clause" that means it could be taken over in 2019. TfL, which will set up a joint management team with the Department of Transport,(DoT) will run services which operate within the capital's boundaries while DoT officials will be responsible for the wider South East.

SPT Signs Up 100,000th Smart Customer

Strathclyde Partnership for Transport (SPT) which operates public transport in Glasgow, Scotland, signed up its 100,000th Smart customer in December 2015 with the lucky recipient, Rizwan Akhtar, receiving a year's free Subway travel. Rizwan Akhtar, from Barrhead in East Renfrewshire, uses the Subway for all-day park and ride at Shields Road to get into St Enoch in Glasgow City Centre; and also to get to Hillhead to attend his evening class at Glasgow University.





As we look for ways to further expand the pets on train programs, we are also excited to announce a new pilot program launching on February 20th, which will bring weekend pet travel (Saturday and Sunday) to our Acela Express service.

Internet comments on the new pet policy ranged from joy from pet lovers to rage from people who are allergic to cats and dogs.

Progressive Railroading reports that the MBTA signed a contract with J.F. White to repair the former Boston and Maine RR Bridge between Beverly and Salem. This will affect both Rockport and Newburyport commuter trains. The bridge's swing span which was built in 1885 will be replaced. The MBTA will close the bridge for 21 days in April 2017 while the swing span is replaced. Two additional

closures will occur in May 2016 holder). and September 2016.

February 18, 2016 will be remembered for a long time by South Station commuters. MBTA/ Keolis and Amtrak trains were badly delayed in entering and leaving South Station due to major signal problems. This problem affected both the morning and evening rush hours. It was an ordinary winter day and there was no snow, ice, or extreme cold to take the blame. Some commuter trains were cancelled. News reports talked about problems with "Tower 1" at South Station. South Station no longer has a traditional railroad signal tower with operators controlling switches and signals. The current "Tower 1" is a building crammed full of electronics but has no crew. The interlocking is remotely operated by a dispatcher in Amtrak's dispatch theatre. Although both MBTA and Amtrak trains use the interlocking, the dispatcher is an Amtrak employee.

Wells Fargo Bank has entered the rail-car finance, leasing and fleet management business. The company recently acquired GE's rail-car and locomotive leasing business and now owns more than 175,000 rail cars and 1,800 locomotives. (Full disclosure: Your columnist is a Wells Fargo stock

The Boston Globe had some good advice for the MBTA Fiscal Control Board. The board is looking at the Ashmont to Mattapan trolley line as a place to save money. This line runs with historic PCC type trolley cars which are about 70 years old. The Globe names several cities around the nation which now regret getting rid of trolleys and are spending big money to bring them

RAILPACE reports Connecticut DOT plans to replace old diesel powered trains on Shore Line East with modern M-8 electric cars. The old equipment will move to the Hartford line to implement new commuter service.

Boston's Government Center station re-opened 3/21/16 after a 2 year closure for a construction project to improve handicapped access. The Providence Journal reports that the deficit for MBTA trains running south of Providence to T.F. Green Airport and Wickford Junction is much higher than expected. There are also disagreements between the MBTA and the State of Rhode Island in regard to the amount that Rhode Island owes.

Refurbishment of the Boyne Viaduct which spans the River Boyne in Drogheda, Co. Louth, has been completed. The work involved the installation of a new drainage system to collect and remove rainwater, repairs to the steelwork, and the relaying of the track over the viaduct. The old paintwork was removed and replaced with a more suitable and modern protective

Freight trains on the Irish Rail network are smaller in size compared to those use in other parts of Europe where they can be generally be up to 759 meters in length. The maximum length of an Irish Rail container train is 18 x 42ft wagons, which is about one-third that generally used in Europe. 21 wagon trains used to operate between Dublin and Cork, and un-braked loose-coupled goods trains were allowed to operate with up to 75 small 4-wheel wagons, nearly twice the length of current trains. In an effort to increase rail freight competitiveness, Irish Rail is hoping to increase the size of container trains to 27 x 42ft wagons with trials to schedule to take part in February, 2016 as part of the certification process.

In January Irish Rail announced that 39.7M passengers journeys were made in 2015, an increase of 5% on the 2014 figure. Taxsaver revenues and sales volumes grew significantly during 2015, increased by 11% to US\$45 M.

Dublin City Councilor's were told that during 2015 Irish Rail had spent US\$ 490,000 cleaning graffiti from trains and that the courts were failing to take the issue of criminal damage seriously. 172 incidents of graffiti were recorded in the Dublin suburban area compared to 57 in 2014. There were 79 incidents of vandalism to property compared to 35 in 2014. Incidents of trespass rose to 288, an increase of 10 on 2014. Assistant Police Commissioner Jack Nolan said that graffiti came under the heading of criminal damage and was a matter that could be tackled through education in schools. He admitted that the current police schools programme does not deal with graffiti but that the issue was serious enough to warrant inclusion in it.

Irish Rail hosted a special family fun day at Westport Station, Co.

Mayo on Saturday 30th January to celebrate 150 years of the railway to Westport. Festivities kicked off at Noon with face painters on hand to entertain the kids while the Westport House Road Train gave free trips around the town to children of all ages. The Westport town band provided music and refreshments were served. Display boards showed familiar faces of the many, many Westport people that have worked on the railroad through the

On February 17th it was announced that due to flooding in Ballycar, the railroad line between Limerick and Ennis remained closed until further notice and that bus transfers would continue to operate between Ennis, Co. Clare, and Limerick City with restricted service into and out of Sixmilebridge. With water levels continuing to rise, this disruption was expected to continue until the end of April 2016 at the earliest.

On February 15th, Locomotive 226 was observed with a Dublin Hueston Station Yard to Sallins test train drawing 16 autoballaster wagons with Locomotive 8209 dead

By James Scannell at the rear and believed to be the heaviest train to run on the Irish Rail network. Engineer Reminder Appliance (ERAs) have been fitted to all operational trains - this involved fitting out 308 engineer's cabs at a cost of US\$ 550,000.

In Northern Ireland, following two years of negotiation, Translink has been awarded a contract to exclusively public transport in Northern Ireland, including rail services, for a period of five years.

In Belfast City Mott MacDonald has been awarded the contract for design checking the proposed double tracking for the Dargan Viaduct, built in 1994. The work will involve confirming the Proof of Concept for widening the existing viaduct; the designing of pier and pile strengthening solutions for track strengthening; and the construction work of piers and foundations in an initial section.
