



# **The Roundhouse**

The Washington Post reports that the architectural firm credited with the design work for the restoration of New York's Grand Central Terminal has been chosen for a major project at Washington Union Station. Beyer Blinder Belle, with offices in New York and Washington, oversaw design, master planning, and the revitalization of New York's Grand Central Terminal, turning the 1913 Beaux Style railroad station into a more modern, accessible and efficient rail hub. The firm has done similar work rehabilitating historic buildings in Washington including work for the Smithsonian. At Union Station, the company will team with Grimshaw Architects to plan a massive expansion of rail and passenger capacity at Union Station that will allow the project to qualify for federal funds in future years. Grimshaw is a specialist in railroad station design, having worked on the Fulton Center in New York, Amsterdam's Bijlmer Station and London's Waterloo rail station. Amtrak issued a statement from Bob LaCroix, deputy chief of infrastructure and investment in the Northeast, saying that "with growing demand for passenger rail service, it is imperative that we continue to advance our vision for the future of Washington Union Station."

Not everyone is happy about the return of passenger service to the so called "Knowledge Corridor" in Western Massachusetts. (This line used to be called the B&M Connecticut River Main Line). The Daily

Hampshire Gazette reports numerous complaints from people who own homes or businesses near the tracks. The big complaint is piles of old ties. These ties contain creosote. There have also been complaints by the Holyoke and Northampton fire departments. Massachusetts DOT has promised a big clean up in the fall. How does this help the communities involved survive the spring and summer brush fire seasons?

The Greenville Junction Depot (Maine) Friends have signed a long-term lease of the depot building and its immediate property from the Central Maine & Quebec Railway. The nonprofit Friends are attempting to save and restore the 125-year-old former Greenville Junction Canadian Pacific depot. The building was constructed in 1889, with a rounded "witches hat" and ladies' waiting room added sometime between 1901 and 1910.

TRAINS Magazine published a short piece on the Metropolitan Transportation Authority celebrating a milestone of New York City's subway. The celebration commemorates the 100th anniversary of the opening of the first complete subway. On June 22, 1915, the Brooklyn Rapid Transit Co., or BRT, that would later become the Brooklyn-Manhattan Transit Corp., or BMT, opened its first subway with much pomp and circumstance with Manhattan to Coney Island service. Its first train crossed the East River to downtown Brooklyn via the Manhattan

Bridge and then headed out to Coney Island using the new Fourth Avenue Subway and Sea Beach Lines. The inaugural ride from Chambers Street to Coney Island took 48 minutes, according to the Brooklyn Daily Eagle. It was New York City's second subway company and, in its time, one of the most innovative transit networks in the world. New York may have a much larger system but Boston also has a rich subway heritage. The first lines were built by private enterprise, not government.

The Lower Hudson Journal News reported Thirteen (13) current and former Metropolitan Transportation Authority workers were indicted on 6/29/2015 on charges they cheated on safety tests required to become Metro-North engineers and conductors, authorities said. The employees are accused of sharing copies of the questions and answers before they took the tests, which help determine how much a candidate knows about critical information including train traffic signals, speed limits and emergency procedures. Nine (9) of the employees were suspended from their jobs on Friday, and four have been fired, according to the Metropolitan Transportation Authority.

A three-way partnership between Steamtown National Historic Site, Norfolk Southern, and the Lackawanna & Wyoming Valley Historical Society will operate excursions on Sept. 12th and 13th behind Nickel Plate Berkshire No. 765 from Scranton, PA to Binghamton, NY. and return. The excursions will also mark the 100th anniversary of the Tunkhannock Viaduct. The Lima-built 2-8-4 will operate round-trip excursions with a stop at Nicholson for passengers

to visit an anniversary in the town of Nicholson, at the base of the soaring concrete viaduct. Passengers who detrain at Nicholson will be picked up by the train returning from Binghamton later in the day. The trains will also feature an A-B-A lash-up of EMD F3 locomotives owned by the Tri-State Railway Historical Society and the Anthracite Railroads Historical Society.

Proceeds from the trips will help move forward the restoration of Boston & Maine Lima 4-6-2, No. 3713 at Steamtown. For details and ticket information go to www.laurellinesspecials.org

Metro North Commuter Railroad has retired its M4 and M6 electric multiple unit cars.

Vermont Public Radio says the Vermont Agency of Transportation has a plan to expand rail passenger service throughout the state. From this wish list it looks like the most realistic is a plan to Extend Amtrak's Ethan Allen from Rutland to Burlington by 2019.

The Utica, NY Observer-Dispatch newspaper reported on a bizarre accident at Utica Union Station. A New York, Susquehanna and Western Railway freight car loaded with plastic pellets was set in motion, apparently as a result of an unknown person tampering with the brakes. It rolled through Utica hitting one automobile and then crashed into an ex-New York Central steam engine on display at Union Station. The steam engine was pushed into a wall at Union Station doing considerable damage.



# Lines fr#m Ireland - April to June 2015

Dublin Airport, which is 12 miles north of downtown Dublin, is unique in that it is one of the few main European airports that does not have a direct rail to a major city. This may change in the near future, as the National Transport Authority is considering a DART service to Dublin Airport terminals 1 and 2 to bring passengers to the Dublin's downtown area making it possible to connect with the rest of the DART and InterCity (long distance) service as well as the nationwide bus service operated by Bus Eireann. At the present time, some Bus Eireann services call at terminals 1 and 2.

The proposed DART rail link would be fully integrated into the existing Dublin city rail network with direct DARTs from the airport to the downtown area with a 20 minute journey time running from 5 a.m. to 1 a.m. daily.

The project would deliver the long sought Airport to city rail link at a fraction of the cost of the other projects, with costs estimated at US\$350M.

The alignment from the Airport rail link from the Airport to Clongrigffin is directly under the airport's main flight path and is undeveloped making construction possible without disruption to residential or commercial interests.

Airport services could be operated by the existing DART fleet as peak flows on an Airport rail service are generally the opposite of city commuter demand.

Its estimated that 3M air travelers per year would use the service at opening, with the service likely to appeal to many of the 15,000 employees working on the airport campus.

The project could be completed in as little as four years.

The project would also fit into the proposed expanded network; were DART Underground to proceed, with Airport DARTs operating directly to the Docklands/Irish Financial Services District; Pearse Station, St. Stephen's Green, Christchurch and Hueston stations, in such a network, all of which are key business, commercial, and tourism areas. This would also connect the national rail network at Hueston Station to a direct DART network, to the city and Dublin Airport.

Under the National Transport Authority options being studied, this project could also be delivered along with a light rail link to Swords, Co. Dublin, ensuring that all the transport requirements in the North Dublin areas are met.

In April the National Transport Authority announced that 1M LEAP cards (similar to the Oyster cards used on the UKs Transport for London bus, trail and tube systems) had been sold since its launch in 2012, and that these cards are used for 60% of public transport journeys in the Greater Dublin Area. LEAP fares are less than cash fares. Monthly turnover is in the region of US\$17M and these can be used on Dublin Bus, Irish Rail, DART and Bus Eireann (long distance buses). Visitors to Ireland can purchase a special 72-hour LEAP card at Irish airports which allows unlimited travel for 72 hours starting from when the card is first used.

The Railway Preservation Society of Ireland, Ireland's premier steam locomotive preservation society, has been granted a license to use the former Locomotive Shed in Dublin's Connolly Station for locomotive storage. Steam locomotive 461 was moved into the shed in May.

Between March and June Irish Rail

By James Scannell began a program of line improvement work on the Dublin to Cork main line, carried out mainly at weekends, focusing this year on the section between Hazelwhatch and Portlaoise. This investment this year of US12M in line improvements will result in higher reliability smoother running of trains, and with other works, deliver consistent speeds of 160kms / 100mph, by the end of 2016 on this section, which in the end will deliver journey time improvements to passengers. The work, which will not finish until November this year, involves improving the track substructure by the removal and replacement of degraded crushed stone ballast which supports the railroad track structure. Train drainage and track geometry will also be improved.
